

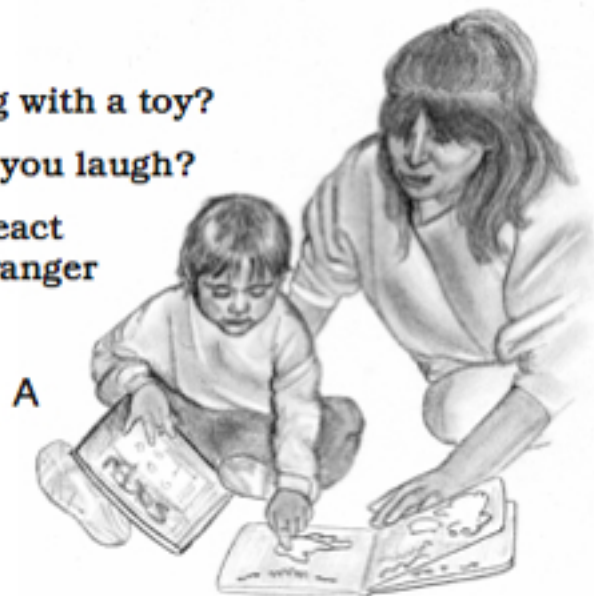
The Nipissing District Developmental Screen™ is a checklist designed to help monitor your child's development.

By Fifteen Months of age, does your baby...

- 1. Usually have healthy ears (i.e. no serious ear infections)?
- 2. Attempt to say two or more words? (Words do not have to be clear.)
- 3. Look at pictures while you name them? (Picture A)*
- 4. Try to get something by making sounds, while reaching or pointing?
- 5. Imitate a few animal sounds?
- 6. Use connected sounds that seem like little stories?
- 7. Respond to own name when called?
- 8. Pick up and eat finger food?
- 9. Start to recognize body parts on self and dolls?
- 10. Crawl up stairs/steps?
- 11. Walk sideways holding onto furniture?
- 12. Try to squat to pick up a toy from the floor?
- 13. Remove socks and try to undo shoes?
- 14. Stack two blocks?
- 15. Use two hands while playing with a toy?
- 16. Repeat an action that made you laugh?
- 17. Look at you to see how to react (e.g. after falling, when a stranger enters the room)?
